Catechist’s Assistant

Help a catechist by being a presence in the classroom, teaching lessons, making copies, getting together supplies, moving chairs, cleaning up, cutting out objects for lessons, hearing children’s prayers, etc. VIRTUS training is required.

Substitute Catechist

Fill in for a catechist who cannot teach their class. We provide you with full lesson plans for the class. See description of Catechist for more details. VIRTUS training is required.

Chaperone

Go with students on retreats and field trips. The Confirmation retreat requires an overnight stay. Take students to talks provided by SCORE (Sheboygan County Organization of Religious Educators) and/or other speakers and attend with them. VIRTUS training is required.

Grade Level Event Helper

Help with special projects such as First Eucharist Retreat, Confirmation reception, Advent Family Evening, Lenten projects, etc. Set up tables, collect supplies, help students with cutting, gluing, serve food, drink, etc. VIRTUS training is required.

Office Help

Be available to answer phones and call parents of students who are absent during Wednesday night classes. Help with office projects like stuffing envelopes, making copies, etc. VIRTUS training is required.

Pray for RE on a Regular Basis

Pray for catechists, aides, students, and all those involved in teaching our children the Catholic faith.

Traffic Monitor

Monitor the playground and maintain order at the doors before the 5:45 PM and 7 PM Religious Education classes. VIRTUS training is required.

Procedures and a four-month Lectors Schedule are listed on the parish's website or if you do not have a computer, paper copies will be provided to you.

Extraordinary Ministers

Sacristan Ministers

They perform 2 hours of apostolic work (visit new parishioners; homebound persons and nursing home residents; transport the elderly to Mass, doctors, and shopping; lead the Rosary at wakes and in Church) every week and pray the Rosary and Legion prayers daily.
